Among the rooms, **studioutte**'s Limen collection features low-to-the-floor tables distilled to their purest portal shape. And not to be missed, the Knot Table — an

Archiproducts award-winning design from D8 studio that features intricate Asian weaving patterns creating a gentle rhythm between the legs, offering both beauty and stability.

Michele De Lucchi — an internationally renowned designer, architect and writer – has been one of the biggest names in architecture and the Italian design scene since the 1970s. During the age of radical and experimental architecture, he was a prominent figure in movements like Cavart, Alchymia and Memphis, where he contributed his creativity and inclination for experimentation to designs including furniture, lighting and metal objects. Among his works for major Italian and European brands, his global-bestselling Tolomeo lamp produced by Artemide earned him the Compasso d'Oro award in 1989 and 2001 for Olivetti's printer Artjet10. In his career, he developed numerous important architectural and hospitality projects in Italy and abroad, including cultural, corporate, industrial and residential buildings such as the Triennale di Milano, the Palazzo delle Esposizioni in Rome, the Cini Foundation in Venice, the Neues Museum in Berlin and the Gallerie d'Italia in Milan. At present, Michele De Lucchi is a founder and member of AMDL CIRCLE, a creative multidisciplinary studio renowned for its humanistic architecture and design. Since 2018, AMDL CIRCLE has focused on Earth Stations, future sharing architectures that combine technological development with humanist principles.

About Toan Nguyen

Graduating from the ENSCI (Paris) in 1995, Toan Nguyen pursued his training in Barcelona with Alberto Lievore, and then in Milan with Antonio Citterio for a decade as Head of the Design Department and Partner.

In 2009 he founded his own studio in Milan, subsequently embarking on a series of successful collaborations with several major brands in high-quality industry and fine craftsmanship in Europe, North America, and Asia, on furniture, lighting, ceramics, as well as on technological products.

For Toan Nguyen design is a discipline intimately bound up with the object, in the traditional sense of the term. Priority is given to physical relationships with users. Displaying an immediate sense of meaningful utilization, precedence is accorded to intelligible forms and optimized manufacturing processes, without, however, ever neglecting the sensuality of materials and the emotional impact of the object.

Toan Nguyen's creative individuality has been acknowledged by flagship contemporary design brands such as District Eight, Dedon, Fendi Casa, Laufen, Rolf Benz, Vibia, Brown Jordan, Coalesse, RH, Studio TK, Lema, Viccarbe, Walter Knoll, Wendelbo, among others, a substantial number of whose creations have been awarded prestigious international prizes.

About Adam Goodrum

Adam Goodrum founded his Sydney design studio in 2006. A design obsessive since graduating from the University of Technology Sydney in Industrial Design, his practice is characterized by invention and curiosity, while his aesthetic and approach are inflected with rigor and integrity. Focusing on furniture, product and collectible design, his work is inherently elegant, often underpinned by a poetic union between art and mathematics. The recipient of every major national design accolade, he has worked internationally with Alessi, Cappellini and Kvadrat and locally with Nau and Tait. Adam is half of Adam&Arthur, a practice exploring the nexus of traditional straw marquetry craftsmanship and contemporary object design. Adam's work has been showcased throughout the world and is collected by museums in Australia and internationally.

Established in 2020 by Milan-based architects and designers Guglielmo Giagnotti and Patrizio Gola, studioutte is a multidisciplinary practice for architecture, interiors, furniture and objects. Through a clear, expressive approach that eludes reiterated and extreme elements, the aim is purity, a concentration into a primitive essence. A warm assertiveness meets an animistic devotion to objects and interiors. Reaching beyond the formality of simplicity, ideas are distilled into essential poetic forms and spaces.
